This guide is organized into the following sections: business, home, electronic, and special group activities (for organizations such as Scouts or church groups). But feel free to read through all of the activities until you find something you might like to try. The function of the guide is an idea starter—to give you some ideas on how you can use your camera in addition to some of the traditional ones that may have prompted you to purchase the camera.

Tips on Organizing Your Photo Files

The key to enjoying using your photos is finding them on your computer when you are ready to do a project. This also saves time. You may wish to save your photos by album with dates—i.e. vacation and then by specific —i.e. big animals. If you have the images stored in two locations, it is easy to reference. Or, you can also do a search, if you have identified each photo in your album, using PhotoBase -the software that came with your digital camera. Your best practice is to create a folder with an appropriate name. Each time you save a photo that pertains to that topic, place it there.

Getting the Most Out of Your Camera Features The Ricoh RDC-4200 digital camera has some nice features you may wish to use for some of these projects:

- time lapse for capturing sunsets, flowers opening
- sepia for adding an antique or aged look to
- black and white photos for special effects
- zoom for capturing distant subjects
- macro for detailed close-ups
- uncompressed TIFF file format for large 8 x 10 prints

Be sure to look in your camera manual or check your tip card to see how to operate and use these special features

Taking Advantage of the Included Software

Sometimes images do not come out as nicely as expected or photo situations are not ideal. Using the photo editing software that comes with the RDC-4200 digital camera, you can improve images as well as add special effects. As an example:

- sharpen or soften image
- crop extraneous areas
- add contrast
- stitch together images for collages
- and many more



Storing Images

If you do not want to store the images on your hard drive, you may wish to invest in a CD-RW (CD-ReWritable) drive from Ricoh. These drives are inexpensive devices for saving images and can provide you with a means of sending many images inexpensively to your friends, relatives or business associates. The CD can then be read on nearly any CD-ROM drive.

Business Applications

Today small businesses can compete effectively with large businesses if they have the right tools and know how to use them. With a minimum investment in the right software, hardware, and marketing smarts, your home office could have the same image as a large company.

Computers, printers, and digital cameras are typically purchased with software. Before you buy additional software, you may wish to take an inventory of the types and functions of software that you presently own. Many software packages come with templates that are easy to use—simply drop your digital images in and you can create professional appearing cards and reports. It is easy to customize these templates with your own logo, color selection and digital image.

Before you get started, check your printerDepending on your printer, be sure to check the following before getting started:

- always check to see if you have the paper you need and a backup ink cartridge(s)
- low cost printers that are three-color are not recommended for printing photos
- when printing on special paper types, check the Paper tab of the Print Settings dialog box.
- if you are getting streaks or a faded image, check the print cartridge; if it is dry, replace it. If it still has ink, shake it and reinstall, making sure to snap it firmly into place. If the problem persists, replace it.
- if your images still do not look good, check

to see if you have selected the right print quality on your printer—if may be set at "economy" or for low resolution quality.

be sure to consult your printer manual.

Choosing the right paper

Each paper projects a different image and is designed to be used with specific printing technology.

- 20-pound paper is usually used in plain paper fax machines, printers or copiers where quality is not a consideration—it is also relatively inexpensive and good for trial or proof copies
- 80-pound cover is recommended for business cards, invitations and postcards.
 Always check to make sure your printer will handle the heavier card stock before investing
- 24-pound stationery with a watermark is ideal for stationery
- the more absorbent a paper's surface is, the more likely ink is to spread, creating a fuzzy image and dull colors—coated papers have a glossier appearance and will make colors and photos "pop"
- be careful using textured paper—it may impact the effect of your digital image; additionally not all textured papers work well in ink jet or other printers
- consult your printer manual for other paper recommendations



You can also create special recipe cards with your own name and recipes as a gift; as well as custom labels for jams, jellies, flavored vinegar or even bottled beer or wine.





Fabric Tips


You can transfer your favorite digital images to fabric in a variety of ways. You'll be amazed with the possibilities that you can create in your own home!


- transferring the image will not harm the photo if you follow directions
- choose photos with good contrast and good color; poorest transfers are from photos which are too dark, too light, or have faded colors

- for a special effect, use the black and white setting or sepia setting on your RDC-4200 digital camera when you shoot the image
- if you choose to transfer your image on a textured or printed fabric, the texture or fabric will show through the image
- use photos-to-fabric transfer paper—several brands are available—and make sure the paper is compatible with your printer. Always follow all manufacturer's instructions for the best results
- if you do not want to invest in the paper, you can go to a local copy shop that offers this
- if you want to transfer your image to fabric and stitch the image, go to






GIFT GIVING TIPS—FAST!!!

Electronic Tips


Today it has never been easier to set up your own website either for viewing by family or for business. Using digital images, you can easily update your website on a daily basis. Here are some tips for setting up your website:

- most browsers can display background images. These images can be small rectangular images that fill the window. Don't make background tiles too small experiment. The larger the tile, the longer it will take to download and for the screen to re-draw. Experiment!
- type selected to go over your background needs to be chosen carefully for readability; put dark type on a light background and light type on a dark background
- once a JPEG image is downloaded, it can be reused in multiple instances
- fancy ruled lines, logos, bullets and even animated icons can bring a dull page to life and won't keep the reader waiting
- by keeping the top portion of the web page free of large graphics, you can start reading the page while the images are downloading

Sending E-mail Tips

Send and receive digital photos easily. Here are a few tips:

- don't send full-resolution, high quality photos
- compress images to the 100K size see if you have image compression software to do this
- send photos in small groups or even one at a time
- send photos at night when you don't have to tie up your computer or the Internet lines are less busy

Charity/Fund Raisers/Special Events


Before you get started, one of the best ways to plan an event is to have a theme. By choosing a theme, all items used can tie in to the event and make it more memorable.
